

Amazing SCIENCE opportunity!



Lynn Loomes, co-head at Woodchester Endowed Primary School writes the following:

"Back in July, I submitted an application for Woodchester to become a Small Schools' Science Hub and won an Enthuse grant of £25,000 from STEM York, a national organisation set up to improve young people's lives through the power of STEM (Science, Technology and Maths). The Enthuse grant programme encourages schools to work in collaboration to improve the outcomes of pupils in STEM subjects so that they develop an understanding of the opportunities and careers that are available in STEM. The aim of our hub is to:

- · support our children in accessing better science resources;
- · encourage all children to make good progress in science;
- · provide support and interventions in science, when needed.

Any primary school is able to attend, although the focus for funding is on those that are considered small (a single class or less per intake). In addition, any school is welcome to attend even if they are already working in an Enthuse hub with other schools. Funds are available to put towards CPD attendance, supply cover and purchase new resources that can be shared across the hub.

Thursday 25th January – STEM Science Ambassadors and what they can do for you

Tuesday 5th March – Fair Testing and Planning

Thursday 25th April – Assessment and Progression

Early July – Science Fair at Forest Green Rovers for Y4 and Y5 pupils


SAS Conferences and Briefings

Ella writes "For the last 4 years, early years charity <u>Kindred</u>², have conducted research into what school readiness looks like across the country. Working with Savanta, this annual survey shines a spotlight on the impact of school readiness on children and schools by gaining valuable insights from primary teaching staff.

I was hoping you would be happy to share this year's survey with your primary school colleagues by forwarding this email or sharing the survey link: http://kinsq.org/school-readiness-survey

The survey takes just 5 minutes to complete and we're asking anyone in a primary school with an understanding of the 2023 Reception intake to respond. We're looking for individual responses – so multiple professionals in a school can complete the survey.

This survey remains, we believe, the only comprehensive measure of the developmental state of the Reception intake, and the impact of the issue on schools. The results will be used to help the wider sector, policymakers and the government understand the impact of school readiness on schools and children across the country.
